

## Skeive sokker.

I have made socks that can best be described as leaning socks  
They were actually pretty cool.



How I made them?

I have made an attempt to explain it here:

**Yarn:** Perfect (10 cm =22 stitches)

**Needles:** I have used 2 circular needles of 3.5 mm, 40 cm.

Cast on 54 stitches (27 on each of the two circular needles).

Knit 3, purl 3 for 16cm.

Distribute the stitches so you have 27 stitches on each needle.

One of the needles starts and ends with knit 3, this needle is used to knit heel.



(photo is from the left sock)

Heels is optional, I chose to knit reinforced heel.

Row 1: Slip 1, knit 1. Continue like this until last stitch remaind, knit 1

Row 2: Slip 1, purl

Continue until desired length of heel, finish with row 2

Place a marker after 13 stitches on right side.

Knit to stitch marker, knit 1, [ssk](#) (slip, slip,knit), and knit 1. Turn.

Slip 1 and tighten the thread. Purl until you are at the marker again, knit 1, purl 1, purl 2 together, purl 1 and turn.

Row 1: Slip 1 and tighten the thread. Knit to the last stitch before the "hole", ssk, knit 1 and turn.

Row 2: Slip 1 and tighten the thread. Purl until the last stitch before the hole, purl 2 together, purl 1 and turn.

Repeat these two rows until you have knitted all the stitches on the needle.

Pick up all the stitches along the side of the heel.

Pick up two extra stitches in the corner between foot and heel, by picking up stitches from the round below.

**From this point there is a difference between left and right sock.**

**Left:**

Round starts on the middle of sole on the sock, place a marker at the beginning of the round.

Knit straight until you come to the place where the two masks is picked up from the previous round. Knit these two stitches together

Round 1:Then knit the established pattern purl, knit 3, etc. until you reach the next corner, ssk (this stitch is later on one of the three stitches in a group of three knitted stitches).

Knit 2 , purl 3, knit 3, purl 3, and knit to marker.

Then 1 round is finished. Okay so far?

Round 2:

Knit until it remains 3 stitches on needle. Knit 2 together and knit 1.

Knit in pattern until you reach the last 3 purl stitches. Purl 2 together, purl 1.

Knit in pattern :3 right, 3 wrong, 3 right and 3 wrong for the rest of the round.

Round 3:

No decreases. Knit 3, purl 3 where it should be and knit the stitches under the foot.

Round 4:

Knit until it remains 3 stitches on needle. Knit 2 together and knit 1.

Knit in pattern until you reach the last 3 purl stitches. Purl 2 together, purl 1.

Knit as before for the rest of the round.

Continue decreasing this way until you are back at 54 stitches again.



First needle after finishing decreases:

You are now finished with decreasing on the right side of the sock, so you should knit as established, including purl 2 together and purl 1 on the right side of the heel on the left side of the sock. After knitting: knit 3, purl 3, knit 3 and purl 3, you are going to knit 1, increase 1, and knit the rest of the round.

Next round is knitted without decreasing and increasing.

Continue like this with a round with decrease/increase and a round without decrease/increase until you reach the desired length of the sock before toe.

Knit optional toe.

I choose to decrease two stitches inside the edge stitches on every other round, 5 times.

Then I decrease every round until I have about 10 stitches on each needle, and then I graft the stitches that remain.

## **Right Sock:**

Round starts under the heel.

The first round is the same as the left foot, only decreasing extra stitches at the top corners between the foot and heel.

In the next round you knit so that the last stitches are knit 3, purl 3, knit 3 and purl 3.

You must therefore count the stitches right from the start of the round, and then purl 3, knit 3, purl 3 and knit 3.

Next needle starts with purl 1, then purl 2 together, continue pattern for the rest of the needle.

On the next needle there is the “usual” heel decrease. I knit 1, then ssk, knit the rest of the round

No decreases on next round.

Round 3 is knit as usual.

Next needle starts with purl 1, purl 2 together, usual knit/purl stitches on the rest of the needle.

Decrease in this way until you are back at 54 stitches total, and knit a round without decreasing.

First needle after finishing decreases:

Knit until one stitch remains of the knit stitch section. Increase one stitch, knit 1, then purl 3, knit 3, purl 3, knit 3

Next needle: purl 1, purl 2 together, knit pattern for the rest of the needle.

Next round is without decreasing and increasing.

Continue like this with a round with decrease/increase and a round without decrease/increase until you reach the desired length of the sock before toe.

Knit optional toe.

I choose to decrease two stitches inside the edge stitches on every other round, 5 times.

Then I decrease every round until I have about 10 stitches on each needle, and then I graft the stitches that remain.
